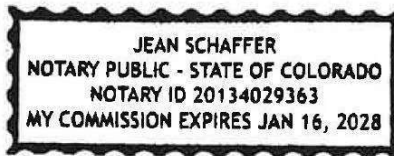

WHEREAS, the Board has appointed its accountant to prepare and submit a proposed budget to the Board in accordance with Colorado law; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board for its review and consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, provided in accordance with Colorado law, said proposed budget was available for inspection by the public at a designated place, a public hearing was held and interested electors of the District were provided a public comment period and given the opportunity to file any objections to the proposed budget prior to the final adoption of the budget by the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Adoption of Budget. The budget attached hereto and incorporated herein is approved and adopted as the budget of the District for fiscal year 2026. In the event of recertification of values by the County Assessor's Office after the date of adoption hereof, staff is hereby directed to modify and/or adjust the budget and certification to reflect the recertification without the need for additional Board authorization. Any such modification to the budget or certification as contemplated by this Section 1 shall be deemed ratified by the Board.

Section 2. Levy of Property Taxes. The Board does hereby certify the levy of property taxes for collection in 2026 as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto.

Section 3. Mill Levy Adjustment. When developing the attached budget, consideration was given to any changes in the method of calculating assessed valuation, including any changes to the assessment ratios, or any constitutionally mandated tax credit, cut, or abatement, as authorized in the District's service plan. The Board hereby determines in good faith (such determination to be binding and final), that to the extent possible, the adjustments to the mill levies made to account for changes in Colorado law described in the prior sentence, and the actual tax revenues generated by the mill levies, are neither diminished nor enhanced as a result of those changes.

Section 4. Certification to County Commissioners. The Board directs its legal counsel, manager, accountant, or other designee to certify to the Board of County Commissioners of Weld County, Colorado the mill levies for the District as set forth herein. Such certification shall be in compliance with the requirements of Colorado law.

Section 5. Appropriations. The amounts set forth as expenditures in the budget attached hereto are hereby appropriated from the revenue of each fund for the purposes stated.

Section 6. Filing of Budget and Budget Message. The Board hereby directs its legal counsel, manager, or other designee to file a certified copy of the adopted budget resolution, the budget and budget message with the Division of Local Government by January 30 of the ensuing year.

Section 7. Budget Certification. The budget shall be certified by a member of the District, or a person appointed by the District, and made a part of the public records of the District.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ASSUMPTIONS**

Disclosures contained in this summary as presented by management, are those that are believed to be significant as of the date of the compilation report and are not intended to be all-inclusive. The disclosures are intended to describe assumptions used during the preparation of the 2026 annual budget. Actual results may differ from the prospective results contained in the budget.

SERVICES PROVIDED

The District was organized in 2009 along with Firelight Irrigation Metropolitan District, Firelight Commercial Metropolitan District, Whispering Waters Irrigation Metropolitan District and Whispering Waters Metropolitan District Nos. 1 and 2. Whispering Waters Metropolitan District Nos. 3, 4, 5, and 6 were organized in 2017. All the Districts combined are referred to as the Districts. The Districts were organized in Weld County, Colorado and are governed pursuant to provisions of the Colorado Special District Act. The Districts were organized to finance, construct, acquire, and, if required or authorized by an intergovernmental agreement with the Town of Firestone, operate and maintain certain streets, traffic safety controls, street lighting, water, sanitary sewer, landscaping, storm sewers, flood and surface drainage and park and recreation improvements.

The District obtained voter approval to retain and spend any excess revenues collected under Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution. The District obtained voter approval to waive the property tax growth limitations of Section 29-1-1702 C.R.S. and Section 29-1-1704 C.R.S for 2026 and all future years.

The District prepares its budget on the modified accrual basis of accounting.

The District has no bonds or leases outstanding.

REVENUE/EXPENDITURES

Property Tax

Property taxes are forecasted based on the mill levy adopted applied to the annual assessed valuation.

The calculation of the taxes levied is displayed on page 2.

Specific Ownership Taxes

Specific ownership taxes are set by the State of Colorado and collected by the County Treasurer, primarily on vehicle licensing within the County as a whole. The specific ownership taxes are allocated by the County Treasurer to all taxing entities within the County. The forecast assumes that the District's percentage share will be consistent with the amount collected during 2025.

The Districts have entered into an Amended and Restated Cooperation Agreement with the

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ASSUMPTIONS**

Northern Firestone Urban Renewal Authority dated February 7, 2018. Per this agreement, NFURA pledges to pay to the Districts all of the property tax revenues received by NFURA as a result of the property tax mill levy imposed by the Districts upon taxable property within the NFURA area for a period of 25 years from June 12, 2013.

Intergovernmental Transfers

The District levies taxes for operations and transfers those collections to Firelight Irrigation Metropolitan District. The District's administrative costs are then paid by Firelight Irrigation Metropolitan District.

RESERVES

The District has provided for an emergency reserve fund to at least 3% of fiscal year spending for 2025, as defined under TABOR.
